A meeting of the Historic Preservation Commission of the Village of Springville was held at the Municipal Building, 65 Franklin Street, Springville, NY at the above date and time. Present were:

After the Pledge of Allegiance, Acting Chairman Bill Skura called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Acting Chairman Bill Skura then asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the June 9, 2020 meeting.

Don Orton made the motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Helen Brogan. All in favor, none opposed.

The first Application before the Board came from Peggy Austin the director of the Trading Post located at 38 Franklin Street. She is looking for approval of new Siding, Windows, Signage, Awning and Lighting for the building. She brought samples of the Trim for the Windows and the color of the Siding.

The windows will have a Brown Trim and the siding will be a Dark Brownish color of Hardy Plank. She had a picture of what the siding and windows would look like. She did not have Lighting, Signage and Awning

After much discussion and looking at drawings, Acting Chairman Bill Skura asked for a Motion to vote on the Application.

John Baronich made the motion to approve the Siding and Windows project at the property, but the Lighting, Awning and Signage will need to come before the Board once they have better details and specifications. Seconded by Helen Brogan, All in favor, none opposed.

The next Application before the Board came from Tracy Maybray for the Springville Center for the Arts regarding the property located at 31 E. Main Street. Tracy presented Murals to be painted on the building located at 31 E. Main Street. The Murals have already been approved by the Public Art Committee and she is hoping the Historic Preservation Board can do the same.

This is the third year that the Springville Center for the Arts has been doing the Murals. The new intern Claire Hemingway will be painting three sides of the building and the project should be completed mid-August, depending on weather and volunteers.

After much discussion and looking at drawings, Don Orton made a motion to accept the application as presented with the suggestion that the mural goes over the door and loading dock. Seconded by John Baronich, All in favor, none opposed.

Helen Brogan made the motion to adjourn at 7:45 pm, seconded by Don Orton. All in favor, none opposed.
